NOTE FROM A BURRO CALLED PLAYWRIGHT.

Colombia has been facing a humanitarian crisis for decades, with millions of people being displaced due to several armed conflicts between the government, guerillas, narcos, and paramilitary groups. As a result, the displacement crisis in Colombia has been one of the largest in the world, with estimates suggesting 8 million displaced victims since the 1980s.

Animals are also affected by the humanitarian crisis in Colombia. The displacement of people has a ripple effect on animals; being forced to abandon their pets or livestock, animals are vulnerable to starvation, disease, and abuse. In addition, the armed conflict has led to increased illegal mining and deforestation, further threatening the country's survival of many animal species.

For decades, The United States has been providing military aid to the Colombian government's efforts to combat drug trafficking and armed groups. The US has deployed military personnel and private military contractors to train and support the Colombian armed forces. However, the use of private military contractors has been a controversial issue, with concerns raised about their accountability and the potential for human rights abuses.

NOTE FROM A BURRO CALLED PLAYWRIGHT. (CONT)

As a Colombian-American, I have been exposed to the US media's portrayal of Colombian history, which has shaped my perceptions of my homeland. Additionally, as someone with familial ties to Colombia, I also have personal connections and a deeper understanding of the country's culture and history.

I want to express my gratitude to everyone who has contributed to the creation of Hotel Happy. Without the unwavering support and belief of my friends and family, this project would not have been possible. I especially want to thank my wife, Jenny Paredes, for always being my biggest cheerleader and supporting me throughout this journey, and Emily Weiner, for her trust and tireless efforts in making this production happen. A big thanks to our artistic team, Houses on The Moon Theater Company, Estefanía Fadul and Matt Acheson for their invaluable input and perseverance.
