Led by two professional teaching artists experienced in performance and education, HOTM inspires young people in building their creative selves toward a student-centered culminating event in a structured and nurturing environment.

[60m performance] Crafted from immigration court transcripts, interviews and letters, De Novo tells the gripping true story of fourteen year old Edgar Chocoy and his legal fight to remain in the United States. This documentary play offers a rare glimpse into the lives of the thousands of children who make the harrowing journey across the border to become US citizens.

REAL 1

[40m performance]

REAL 1 is a coming-of-age story that grapples with identity, acceptance, and forgiveness through the eyes of an artistic kid growing up in West Harlem in the 1980s. When challenged by a neighborhood bully, he is forced to confront the kind of man he wants to become. This play grapples with themes of gun violence, bullying, loss and love.





gUN COUNTRY

[40m performance]

Built out of workshops with survivors, the bereaved, formerly incarcerated individuals and the NYPD, this collection of diverse true stories highlights those among us whose lives have been touched by guns in one way or another. These visceral narratives create a deeper awareness of gun violence and offer support to those in need.

Following the live performance, post show workshops in multiple small group settings further investigate the themes of the play through storytelling, improvisation and creative writing.
