WHO'S WHO?

HOUSES ON THE MOON THEATER COMPANY whose work has been hailed as "potent" and "powerful" (The New York Times), was founded in 2001. Through creative workshops, original performances, and post-show discussions. Houses on the Moon helps communities come together by making meaningful connections through the public sharing of their untold stories. All Houses projects are created through an extensive developmental and research process in collaboration with its community partners, which have included Amnesty International, the AFSC Immigrant Rights Program, Prison Families Anonymous and many others. At the core of the developmental process are interviews with real people about their lives, and a creative search for those human stories that yearn for a much wider hearing. The company's inaugural production, Building Houses on the Moon, an original play about the lives of LGBT youth, has been performed for students throughout the U.S. and used extensively as a diversity training tool for educators and administrators. In addition to its many ongoing student and Teacher Training performances, was seen at the Lucille Lortel Theatre in New York and the Columbus National Gay and Lesbian Theatre Festival where it won the Award for Best Ensemble Production. TARA'S CROSSING is one of the first plays ever to explore political asylum for refugees fleeing persecution based on their sexual orientation or gender identity. The play had its World Premiere in 2005 at the L.E.S. Tenement Theatre and has been presented widely and used as a training tool on gender identity and legal issues. DE NOVO is a documentary theater piece telling the story of an undocumented immigrant teenager fleeing gang life. The play had its Off Broadway premiere in 2010 at 59E59 St. Theater's Americas Off Broadway Festival, and has been touring nationally and internationally ever since. It was produced again Off Broadway in 2017 at Next Door at New York Theatre Workshop, gUN COUNTRY is a two phased project exploring the role of guns in America. The first phase is a storytelling series with people whose lives have been directly touched by gun violence, and the second phase was THE ASSIGNMENT, a play inspired by these stories. gC is consistently touring - most recently presented in Greenwich, CT. THE ASSIGNMENT premiered Off-Broadway in spring, 2017 at the A.R.T./NY Theatres and was then licensed by Luna Stage in NJ.
